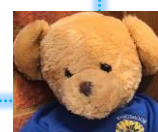

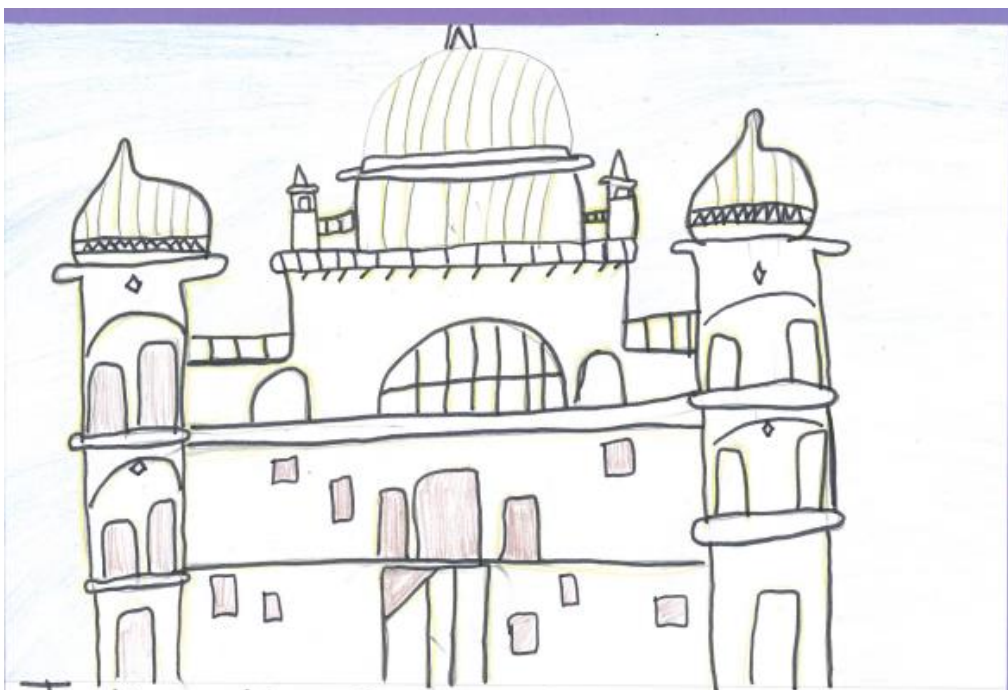
I like the Gurdwara because i like the design
